

FAFC Interaction and Questions

1. Talk about the most important thing you gained from the message on “failure.”
2. Failure is something that we all experience in life. Share a failure that you faced in a relationship, goal, or your walk. Do you believe that failure is avoidable in life? Why or why not? Some people falsely believe that because they have failed at something, they are a failure. Why do we need to see failure only a step to something greater? There is no way to learn something without failing time and again. (Music, vocational, sports and abilities are a few examples)
3. Give your response to these statements:
 - I see failure as an isolated incident
 - I see failure as temporary
 - I see failure as useable by God
 - I see failure as part of a stepping stone
3. Some of the greatest characters in the Bible had great failures. A few would be Abraham, Moses, David, the nation of Israel, and even Peter. Talk about one of these characters (or another you might consider) and what they can teach us about learning from failure. How did it turn into a testimony?
5. In the story in John 21, Peter had failed Jesus by denying Him. What emotion(s) did Peter face after the “rooster crowed?” How did Jesus respond to Peter? How does Jesus respond to us when we have failed? Talk about a time He used one of your failures and turned it into a triumph.
